Michigan AOT law began in 2005. In February 2017, revisions to the law (adopted in 2016) took effect, and more changes were enacted December 2018.

AOT (also known as “Kevin’s Law”) is designed to connect persons with untreated serious mental illness to outpatient services and supports. An individual does not have to be in psychiatric crisis for a court order to be issued.
